Assistant/Associate, Tenure Track Eligible (T/TE) in Environmental Health Sciences

The Environmental Health Sciences unit has an Occupational Health component and seeks an Assistant or Associate Professor who will contribute directly to the teaching, research and service missions of the Mel and Enid Zuckerman College of Public Health. Competitive candidates will be Certified Industrial Hygienists (CIH) with an earned doctorate in Occupational or Environmental Health, Industrial Hygiene or related field. Candidates near completion of their PhD or CIH will be considered. Those applying as Associate Professors should have a record of successful research project completion, an established research focus area and national visibility. Those applying as Assistant Professors must be developing an active research program. In addition to teaching the successful candidate will perform intra- and extramural service, as these are integral components of career progression within the Department and College.

The successful candidates will be expected to seek and secure external funding; engage in both individual and collaborative research; develop and teach undergraduate and/or graduate-level courses; advise/mentor graduate students; participate in service to the college, university, community, and field; and contribute to the research and service missions of the College. The ideal candidate must have an interest in contributing to collaborative, multi-disciplinary approaches of worker protection and health promotion within the workforce.
